STATUTORY COMMITTEES

COLLEGE COUNCIL

The College council shall consist of the Principal and Heads of the Department of each subject of study, two persons elected from the staff members, Librarian of the General Library and the Ministerial Head of Administrative Staff of the College Office.

The Principal shall be the ex-officio President of the Council. The council shall appoint one of the members as the Secretary.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSUARANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was set up in the college in 2009. The IQAC works in accordance with the guidelines issued by the UGC and acts as change agent in the college. The primary aim of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the institution. Dissemination of information of various quality parameters of higher education, documentation of the various programmes and activities leading to quality improvement of the college are some of the important functions of the IQAC. Dr. Seno Jose, Associate Professor of Chemistry, is the coordinator of IQAC.

PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

The objectives of the association include (i) to foster and promote good relationship among the members of the teaching staff, students and parents of the students (ii) to create in members a keen interest for the smooth working of the college and for maintaining good discipline and high academic standards (iii) to collect subscriptions, donations, gifts etc., from members, non-members and the other institutions for furthering the aims and objects of the association (iv) to institute scholarships, prizes, medals etc., to benefit students showing a high proficiency in their studies. Sri. Sanal Raj, Assistant Professor of Physics is the PTA Secretary for the calendar year 2018.

COLLEGE DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE (CDC)

The CDC was constituted by the Government, as per G.O. (Rt) No. 1625/88/H.Edn. dated 17-9-1988. The CDC is empowered to accept donations from students and the public. The members of CDC are the District Collector (Chairperson), the Principal (Secretary/Treasurer), one teacher nominated by the College Council, Chairperson of College Union, President of Alumni Association, Executive Engineer of PWD, and four persons nominated by the DCE. The Committee shall prepare a plan for the development of the college with a view to improving the facilities available including construction/maintenance to be carried out during a period of five years and is responsible for the implementation of schemes in line with the rules and guidelines of the Government. The Committee shall have powers to accept donations from the public.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

College library started functioning soon after the inauguration of the college in 1972. The college authority provides adequate funds for the library and hence we were able to add more titles to the stock every year. There are 12 Newspapers and 35 periodicals both in English and Malayalam subscribed to the library. There are 6 department libraries in addition to the general library. The library is partially automated using the library management software SOUL (Software for University Libraries) developed by INFLBNET. Books are classified using the Dewey decimal classification scheme.

Now the college is a member of the N-List Project (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for scholarly contents) of INFLIBNET. It provides access to eresources to scholarly contents) at INFLIBNET centre. The authorized users can now access e-resources and down loan articles required by them from the publisher's website. We can access more than 4000 e journals and 75000 d-books. The college has a total collection of 44353. Books are purchased once in a year using the state plan fund.

LIBRARY RULES

- 1. The library is open from 9.30 am. to 4.30 pm in every working day with lunch break 12.15 pm to 1 pm. Open access system is followed in the library.
- 2. Students coming to the library should produce their identity cards to the library staff on demand.
- 3. Personal belongings of students are to be kept outside before entering the library.
- 4. Strict silence should be maintained in the library.
- 5. Books are issued for a period of 14 days. After 14 days, rupee 1 per day per book will be charged.
- 6. Five books were issued to P.G. students whereas and three to U.G. students at a time.
- 7. Books damaged or lost must be replaced or three times of the book value should be paid by the borrower.
- 8. Books will be issued in between 10 am to 4 pm students / staff every day and are required to should verify that the books are not damaged before they borrow its. Complaints after the issue will not be considered.
- 9. Books taken out of the library may be recalled at any time.

- (xii) One representative each of I DC, II DC and III DC (For professional colleges, one representative for each year) elected by the students of the respective classes and representative elected by all the PG students.

COLLEGE UNION ELECTION RULES AS PER LYNGDHO COMMITTEE REPORT. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR CANDIDATES.

- 1. Under Graduate students between the ages of 17 and 22 may contest elections. This age range may be appropriately relaxed in the case of professional colleges, where course often range between 4 to 5 years.
- 2. For Post Graduate Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 24-25 years.
- 3. For research students the age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 28 years.
- 4. Although, the Committee would refrain from prescribing any particular minimum marks to be attained by the candidate, the candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
- 5. The candidates should have attained the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the university or 75% attendance, of whichever is higher.
- 6. The candidates shall have one opportunity to contest for the post of officer bearer, and two opportunities to contest for the post of an executive member.
- 7. The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he should not have been tried and/or convicted of any criminal offence or misdemeanour. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the University authorities.
- 8. The candidate must be a regular, full time student of the College and should not be a distance/proximate education student. That is to say that all eligible candidates must be enrolled in a full-time course, the course duration being at least one year.

CENTRE FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION

Aims and Objectives:

- (1). To impart need based training to unemployed youth to increase their employability in key sectors of our economy.
- (2). To offer full time, part-time, formal and non formal programmes to upgrade the management skills to small scale business and industry.
- (3). To provide special training on small business development utilizing locally available resources.
- (4). To conduct vocational training to meet the specific needs of industry and business.
- (5). To conduct retaining for professional and executives in Industry, Business and Service Sector so as to enable them to cope up with the fast changing technological and managerial environment.
- (6). To conduct in service training to workers in the industries of organized and unorganized
- sectors for enhancement of productivity and equip them to meet the changes in technology.
- (7). To establish partnership with industries and commerce for identifying human resource requirements and training needs.
- (8). To make training needs analysis of specific sectors and plan and organize suitable training programmes for them.
- (9). To develop and publish training materials for regular and distance education programmes.
- (10). To identify the areas in which distance education and open learning methods are appropriate and to design and conduct such programmes.
- (11). To identify the employment potential areas and to conduct competency based skill development programmes.
- (12). To undertake such other activities as are relevant to fulfil the objectives of the centre.

RASHTRIYA UCHCHATAR SHIKSHA ABHIYAN (RUSA)

Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) under the ministry of Human Resource is the new funding agency for catering the needs of higher education sector in India. Financial assistance for Institutional development such as academic reforms, infrastructural development of student's amenities improvement, administrative reforms etc. are taken care of by the RUSA through the state Higher Education Council. The College has submitted proposals for its overall development to the RUSA as per the direction of Kerala State Higher Education Council. The proposals were drafted by the RUSA coordination committee and are approved by the council. The institutional coordinator of RUSA is Sri. Dilipkumar P G, Department of Geology. There is an 8-member committee for drafting the proposal and supervising its action plan foreffective utilization of funds.

NCC ARMY WING

One company of NCC Army wing is functioning in the college with a sanctioned strength of 108 cadets, under the command of 16 Kerala Battalion NCC, Kottayam. Lieutenant K. Ramachandran Nair is the associate NCC officer of this sub unit.

NCC NAVAL WING

A naval NCC sub-unit of 5 (K) Naval NCC Unit, Changanacherry is functioning actively. The unit has a trained ANO (Shri. C.D. Cheriyan, Asst. Professor of Economics) and the sanctioned strength is 50.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The NSS has been introduced in colleges and universities all over India in response to the Kothari Commission's recommendation that education should be oriented to the social needs by involving students in service to the community. It is a voluntary organization for students and the teachers. A student volunteer who has completed 240 hrs of work and attended a special camp during the course of two years is eligible for NSS Certificate from the University. This certificate gives weightage for higher studies and is an additional qualification for appointment in public services. Shri. Aravind R. and Smt. Priya P.N. are NSS programme officers.

FEE CONCESSION AND SCHOLARSHIP

Fee concession for SC/ST/OEC student

Students belonging to SC, ST and OEC categories are eligible for full fee concession. They are eligible for stipend.

Educational concession under Kumara Pillai Commission Report(KPCR)

Students, irrespective of their caste or community, are eligible for fee concession, depending on the aggregate annual income of their parents. The annual income should be below Rs. 42,000/- in the case of postgraduate programmes and below Rs. 25,000/- for undergraduate programmes.

Kerala State Scholarship

Awarded by the Director of Collegiate Education, the scholarship is renewable based on the progress and conduct of the student and marks obtained by him/her in the examinations (a minimum of 45 percent marks to be secured.

Scholarships for proficiency in sports

Awarded by the Director of Collegiate Education to the first-year students of each class, who were distinguished themselves by participating in International, National, Inter University, State Championships or Inter-Zonal-Collegiate Competitions.

Stipend for children of fisherman

Children of fishermen are eligible for stipend from the Department of Fisheries.

Suvarna Jubilee Merit Scholarship

- 1. Should be a firstyear student of Under Graduate or Post Graduate course in Govt/ Aided colleges or University Departments.
- 2. Should belong to BPL family.
- 3. Should have scored 50% or above in the qualifying Examination.

Muslim Nadar Girls Scholarship

Should be a first year girls student of HSC/VHSC and under graduate course in Govt/Aided Arts and science college. Should belong to forward of BPL family and backward community

Blind/PH Scholarship

Blind/PH/Deaf students studying in Govt/Aided Arts and Science Colleges, Music Colleges, and Govt/Aided Higher Secondary/Vocational Higher Secondary Schools

Financial Support

- 1. Fee Charges for Blind students with family annual income below Rs. 2.5 lakhs
- 2. Hostel charges for all PH students who are hostellers and whose family annual income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs/-
- 3. Boarding charges for all PH students who are day scholars and whose family annual income is below Rs. 4.5 lakhs

C H Muhammedkoya Scholarship

- 1. Should belong to Muslim, Latin, Converted Christian community and should be a native of Kerala.
- 2. Should be a GIRL student studying for the first year of Graduation or Higher courses in Govt./ Aided Institution.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period. Absence for one period will be treated as absence for half a day
- If leave is required for a single period, application may be submitted to the HOD through the teacher concerned.
- Students absenting themselves from class without leave, for more than 10 continuous days, will have their names removed from the rolls. They may be re-admitted at the discretion of the Principal, in which case they will have to pay the readmission-fee and all other fees due.
- Application for leave of absence should be submitted to the Principal through the teacher-in-charge and HOD.
- The certificate of attendance and progress, required by the University, for
 presentation to a University Examination, will not be granted if (a) the
 student has attended only less than 75% of the total number of working
 days of the semester, (b) the Principal is not satisfied with the student's
 progress and conduct.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT AND SEMESTER SYSTEM

The Higher Education Council, Government of Kerala has taken the initiative to reformulate the undergraduate syllabi by introducing choice based credit and semester system. This is to cope with the internationally followed curricula and mode of evaluation.

Evaluation

There shall be two parts for evaluation:

- (i) Internal or In- Semester Examination or Continuous Assessment
- (ii) External or End- Semester Examination.

The weightage for the Internal and External examinations shall be in the ratio 1:3. Both evaluations shall be done using Direct Grading system based on a 5- point scale as given below

For the successful completion of a programme and award of the degree, a student must pass all courses satisfying the minimum credit requirements and must score a minimum CGPA of 2.00 or an overall grade of C+ or above.

REGULATIONS OF EXAMINATIONS FOR UG PROGRAMMES UNDER CBCSS AND GRADING, 2013

The evaluation of each course shall contain two parts:

- i) Internal or in-Semester Assessment (ISA)
- ii) External or End- Semester Assessment (ESA)

The internal to external assessment ratio shall be 1:4, for both courses with or without practical. There shall be a maximum of 80 marks for external evaluation and maximum of 20 marks for internal evaluation. For all courses (theory & practical), grades are given on a 07-point scale based on the total percentage of marks. (ISA+ESA) as given below:
